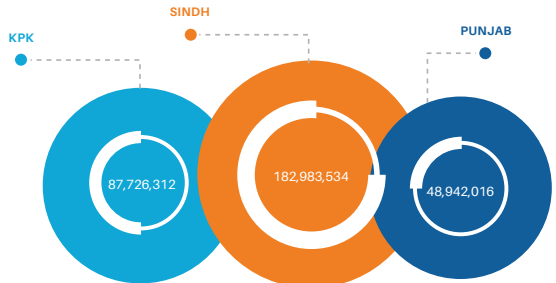

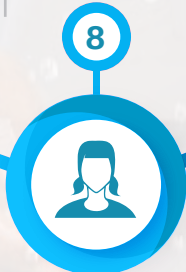

# ABOUT US

Pak Mission Society is a National Humanitarian and Development organization established in 2004. It was founded by a group of Christian professionals whose collective vision is to reach the unreached to bring hope, dignity, respect, and share love through emergency relief efforts and delivering long-term rehabilitation and development programmes. PMS has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Economic Affairs Division (EAD), Government of Pakistan valid till August 2024. We are certified as NPO as per evaluation standards notified by FBR with Pakistan Centre for Philanthropy. Pak Mission Society has reached and served the unreached communities regardless of race, gender, ethnicity, class, religion, and social background. The organization catalyzes holistic transformation and development through the transparent, fair, and rights-based allocation of humanitarian and development efforts.

## THEMATIC INTRODUCTION

According to UNICEF an estimated 70 percent of households still drink bacterially contaminated water in Pakistan, 53,000 children under five die annually from diarrhea due to poor water and sanitation, while 25 million people still practice open defecation. Lack of access to proper water and sanitation facilities impacts negatively the health and well-being of communities, especially the children. Water and Sanitation related diseases especially diarrhea also cause stunting that currently affects almost 44 percent of children in Pakistan.

WASH sector is the niche of Pak Mission Society (PMS) since the year 2010. The organization has implemented significant humanitarian and development projects on WASH in the unreached areas of Pakistan such as Rajanpur, Mirpurkhas, Sanghar, Umerkot, Tando Allahyar, Charsadda, Kohistan, and Shangla with the support of its partners and donors ensuring the provision of basic needs to the unreached communities including clean drinking water, sanitation, and hygiene. These needs are not just crucial for physical survival but also play a vital role in the emotional and psychological existence.

Pak Mission Society placed water sources and schemes around villages to ensure easy access to clean drinking water. Training and awareness sessions are organized with experts to raise the level of knowledge and understanding of sanitation, personal and household-level hygiene.

In the implementation of WASH Projects PMS strives to complement the overall relief and development efforts undertaken by the government, UN, and civil society. PMS works in close coordination and collaboration with the local communities, local administration, district government, UN agencies, CSOs/NGOs, and all related line departments. PMS factors in DRR, Climate Resilience, and Localization in all WASH activities. PMS also uses recommended technical standards of the related UN and other agencies depending upon the activity.
